Baltimore's Artscape returns for its 28th season, July 17-19. This free public arts festival features more than 150 artists, fashion designers and craftspeople, including DIY/new wave crafters. Visual art exhibits including outdoor sculpture, art cars, and photography will be held on- and off-site. A host of concerts and performing arts will be offered including dance, opera, theater, fashion, film, experimental music and performances by the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra.

Family events such as hands-on projects, demonstrations, jazz vocal and combo competitions, and children's entertainers will abound. An array of international foods will also be available.

Artscape will be held at Mount Royal Avenue & Cathedral Street/Charles Street in the Bolton Hill neighborhood & Station North Arts & Entertainment District.
